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SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: Good evening. I'm sorry that we're starting a little late. I would ask if everyone could please rise for the Pledge of Allegiance.

(Pledge of Allegiance.)

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: Thank you. Mr. Wink, if you would please call the meeting to order.

MR. WINK: Town of North Hempstead Board Meeting, Tuesday, December 19th, 2017. Councilwoman DeGiorgio.

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: Here.

MR. WINK: Councilman Ferrara.

COUNCILMAN FERRARA: Here.

MR. WINK: Councilwoman Kaplan.

COUNCILWOMAN KAPLAN: Here.

MR. WINK: Councilwoman Russell.

COUNCILWOMAN RUSSELL: Here.

MR. WINK: Councilwoman Seeman.

COUNCILWOMAN SEEMAN: Here.

MR. WINK: Councilman Zuckerman.

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: Here.

MR. WINK: Supervisor Bosworth.

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: Here. So following our Town Board procedures, we will open the meeting with 30 minutes of public comment on any matters not having to do with items on the agenda. We do ask that you limit your comments to three minutes. And, Mr. Wink, I know that you will make sure we stay on track.

MR. WINK: Indeed.

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: Do you have any cards?

MR. WINK: We have one card from Peter Gaffney.

(Whereupon, the public comment portion of the agenda was off the record.)

(Whereupon, the Town Board meeting agenda resumed.)

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: So Mr. Wink, would you please strike item No. 23 and begin tonight's agenda.

MR. WINK: Continuations: Item No. 1, a public hearing to consider the rescission and adoption of an ordinance affecting Park Avenue in Carle Place.

COUNCILWOMAN RUSSELL: So this is a continuation from our last meeting regarding Fairfield Avenue. I did go out and make a site visit with some of the residents that are here this evening and we are -- I'm asking the Town Board if we can vote this down. We have decided, along with the residents, to keep the restrictions in place as they are. The persons that were asking for it have had a change of heart and they saw the detriment, safety reason why -- to keep it --the restrictions in place. And so I know there's a couple of residents here. If you'd like to speak, you can.

MR. WINK: Councilwoman, we have a card from Lou Volpano.

COUNCILWOMAN RUSSELL: Yes.

MR. WINK: Forgive me. Volpano, Volpato.

COUNCILWOMAN RUSSELL: It's Volpato.

MR. WINK: Alright.

MR. VOLPATO: Thank you.

MR. WINK: Thank you.

MR. VOLPATO: Supervisor Bosworth, Council folk -- Councilmembers --

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: Councilmembers.

MR. VOLPATO: Councilmembers. Good evening. Thank you. Lou Volpato, 85 Park Avenue. Councilwoman Russell, you visited me and we did have an issue parking. You asked if it was okay and I said you really should park in the driveway. I don't know if there is – I believe Traffic said removing the restrictions would be okay.

COUNCILWOMAN RUSSELL: Well, we're planning to go ahead and change the restrictions on some of the streets.

MR. VOLPATO: You are?

COUNCILWOMAN RUSSELL: We were.

MR. VOLPATO: You were.

COUNCILWOMAN RUSSELL: We were. But after making the site visit and I spoke with you, as well as the other neighbors, the initial surveys that we got back, the majority of those people had changed their minds. And so when we re-surveyed the neighbors on the street, they did change their minds with regard to changing the restriction.

MR. VOLPATO: Okay. Well, first and foremost, I do consider myself a good neighbor.

COUNCILWOMAN RUSSELL: Yes.

MR. VOLPATO: And we'll go with the majority. And I'm only here asking for some of the same privileges that some of my neighbors, including some of the people that are here today, and that is to be able to park in front of my house without -- without getting a ticket. Can the proposal be amended to please everyone?

COUNCILWOMAN RUSSELL: Do you have a suggestion other than what was already suggested?

MR. VOLPATO: That the restrictions be kept in place for my block south and just changed from my block as we discussed, no parking from a certain spot to the corner on both sides. That would make both neighbors happy with parking in front of my house.

COUNCILWOMAN RUSSELL: That's something -- we would have to have a parking -- traffic

technician to go out and re-measure and look at the case all over again. But at this point, for this particular hearing, I am asking the board to vote no on this particular one to change the restrictions in general as proposed.

MR. VOLPATO: Understood. Thank you for your time.

MR. WINK: No other cards.

COUNCILWOMAN RUSSELL: You can have -- Mr. Vesta.

MR. VESTA: Thomas Vesta. I reside at 222 Fairfield, 120 feet from Park Avenue. I came really to say thank you to Ms. Russell. She was local government at its finest. She did due diligence. She didn't take my word for it or anybody's else's word for it. She came and looked. If the restrictions were dropped, somebody would possibly get hurt because it would be that dangerous. So I thank her and I thank you all and wish you all a very happy holiday and I'm very pleased with the outcome. Merry Christmas.

COUNCILWOMAN RUSSELL: And happy holidays to you too.

MR. VESTA: Thank you.

COUNCILWOMAN RUSSELL: Is there anyone else wishing to be heard?

(No response).

COUNCILWOMAN RUSSELL: Seeing no one, I'd like to close the public hearing, offer the resolution and ask the board to vote no.

MR. WINK: Councilwoman De Giorgio.

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: No.

MR. WINK: Councilman Ferrara.

COUNCILMAN FERRARA: No.

MR. WINK: Councilwoman Kaplan.

COUNCILWOMAN KAPLAN: No.

MR. WINK: Councilwoman Russell.

COUNCILWOMAN RUSSELL: No.

MR. WINK: Councilwoman Seeman.

COUNCILWOMAN SEEMAN: No.

MR. WINK: Councilman Zuckerman.

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: No.

MR. WINK: Supervisor Bosworth.

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: No.

MR. WINK: Public hearings. Item 2, a public hearing to consider the adoption of a local law amending Chapter 70 of the Town Code entitled "Zoning."

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: So this is a proposed moratorium. All we're doing tonight is proposing that we sort of take a pause and not consider any -- there are no pending

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applications but it would also prevent us from considering any future applications for the next six months in the Business BW Zone in Port Washington. It's a small zoning area. It affects from Manhasset Bay Dolphin Green, Manhasset Bay Yacht Club, the Shipyard, LaPalma, Campbell's Carpet, Inspiration Wharf, Louie's. And it does include the Town dock and Sunset Park but those are owned by the Town and by the Port Washington Water Pollution Control District. The reason for the moratorium is simply this. There was -- the BW District was enacted over a decade ago -no, actually probably maybe nine years ago. And since that time, we've had one project developed but we've had some major storms. We're looking at sustainable infrastructure. We're looking at doing work on the Town dock. And I think it's important for the Town to revisit the BW Zone and make sure that we're achieving the goals that were originally set forth by the Town Board when they enacted it. We have already met internally to look at the Code. We do -- we are looking at changing it. We don't have a plan right now so there's not a lot to share in terms of ways in which we would change it. I think we've all talked about what our priority is. My priority is to maintain public access to the waterfront and to make sure that we don't lose a very important commercial district in Port Washington. A lot of what we've been focusing on collaboratively with the Chamber of Commerce, the BID, the Residents for a More Beautiful Port Washington, Waterfront Advisory Committee, is promoting Port Washington as a destination. And one of the biggest reasons Port Washington is a destination, the area that we focus on is our waterfront. It's crucially important to the people of Port Washington and I'll argue to the Town of North Hempstead, you know, at large, because it's one of the few public -- public waterfronts that are available. So a little bit about the process. Again, we're still talking about it at the Town. But the process -- any changes to the Zoning Code will be done in a way that's very open and very transparent. You know, we talked about that. We'll have probably at least two public hearings on the actual Zoning Code and we'll have at least one public meeting, which won't be a hearing but it will be open to the public and we'll share, you know, potentially what we're looking at to do at the public hearings. And I anticipate meeting with, you know, most if not all, of the stakeholders, the property owners, the business owners, the people that have an interest down there can reach out to my office and I will make sure that everybody's voice is heard and that we do consider everyone's perspective. And I think ultimately I'm looking forward to making the BW District better and stronger and sort of meeting the vision that I think the community of Port Washington has for its waterfront. I know the Supervisor has been a supporter and --

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: I have.

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: Yeah, I know you have.

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: I thought when the Councilwoman suggested it, that it was a good suggestion. You can never go wrong by taking a step back, examining and seeing where we want to go in the future. And so I think this is a timely proposal. And, of course, we do want to hear from all of those who are here today --

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: Absolutely.

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: — who would like to make their opinions heard. And we look forward to the rest of the hearing.

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: Yes. I think we should let -- let the public speak, unless anybody on the board wants to say anything.

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: Mr. Wink, do you have any cards?

MR. WINK: A few.

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: Okay.

MR. WINK: The first card I have is Nancy Costanoble.

MS. COSTANOBLE: Good evening everyone. I'm Nancy Costanoble. I live at 15 Second Avenue in Port Washington. And I have -- can I present an exhibit to the board? And just in case anybody's interested, I'll pass a couple of photos around to demonstrate what happened to my waterview when the Knickerbocker Building went up. Yeah. As you can see from that photo, once upon a time when I moved into that house, I had waterviews. Now more than 50 percent of them are gone. Who do I sue to get the value of my property back on that one? So anything you can do to take time to get input from people who live there as to how this is going to affect us, would be greatly appreciated. I'm very concerned about what I hear about your potentially changing the Zoning Codes. Had that building been built to Code, had there only been two stories there, I believe I would have retained at least a certain portion of my water view. There are also tax implications for those of us who live in the area who may lose value of our property if there are large commercial structures that go up that block our views. So -- and I'm also concerned for the present. I hadn't realize that this was actually going to stretch as far as the Town dock because I'm right in the middle of the area that's going to be affected by that. So thank you for the proposed moratorium. And all I'm asking is that, yes, you take your time and consider how this is going to affect those of us that who live in that neighborhood.

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: Thank you.

MS. COSTANOBLE: Thank you.

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: Ms. Costanoble, would you like this picture back?

MS. COSTANOBLE: No. I have my own copies.

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: Okay. We'll make this part of the record.

MS. COSTANOBLE: Thank you.

MR. WINK: Mindy Germain.

MS. GERMAIN: Good evening. I am Mindy Germain, 19 Beacon Drive, Port Washington. I am the Executive Director of Residents Forward, formerly known as Residents For a More Beautiful Port Washington.

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: It's going to take a little time to get used to that, you know that.

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: Yeah.

MS. GERMAIN: I appear before the Town Board this evening on behalf of Residents in full support of this proactive, positive, six-month waterfront moratorium. Residents are starting to hear tonight about the process of what we're going to -- the path forward over the next six months and we would just like to share some input in that process. We request that if the Town adopts this moratorium, that it commits to properly engaging an expert consultant to guide a comprehensive review with meaningful public participation, which it sounds like is a priority for the Town as well, in the review and planning process. A moratorium creates an opportunity for all interested parties to investigate prospective development guidelines with the assistance of an expert consultant to protect and advance the vibrancy, sustainability and public access to Port Washington's waterfront.

With this proposed moratorium and a robust community visioning process, waterfront zoning on Manhasset Bay can be reevaluated to incorporate best practices, as well as community goals before new development proposals are evaluated by the Town and other interested parties. The recommendations that will be produced by such an effort will impact future tourism, our economy and the vibrancy and resiliency of our community's waterfront. It will impact recreational opportunities and the development of complementary business import. It will shape how residents and visitors experience the Port's waterfront for generations to come. For all of these reasons, Residence supports the moratorium and asks the Town to engage a qualified and independent expert to guide this investigative process to include meaningful public participation and to keep this effort confined to an expeditious time table. Thank you.

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: Thank you.

MR. WINK: Joel Ziev.

MR. ZIEV: Good evening, everyone. I'm Joel Ziev, I live at 17 North Plandome Road in Port Washington. Which hat am I wearing tonight? It's my own. I'm a member of Residents Forward and I live right near the water in Bay View Colony and I'm a member of the yacht club, the North Shore Yacht Club. Many of us here had spoke with the site plan review of what's now known as Knickerbocker. We looked at that. We had a lot of people speaking. We had a lot of concerns expressed. As the first person who spoke regarding the view corridors and as I recall as part of that review of the site plan that was approved by the board, was to include an ADA walkway along the waterfront side of the building. In addition, in response to questions regarding the blocking of the view from the water from the upland, we were assured that there would be a view corridor maintained on both the north and south side of the building. I'm not talking about the height, just a regular view for people walking by. The current plan as built does not include the walkway. There is no accessible walkway and I tried it today just to make sure they didn't build one overnight. There's no accessible walkway from the south side of the building to the north side along the water. There is a walkway but it goes to a fence and the fence blocks passage to LaParma and you can't continue it along the way. What good is it to have a public hearing and a public meeting without board voting on something without any restrictions or anybody policing it. And in this case, both items were voted by the Town Board on the site plan review and everyone was yes, yes, we achieved that and then they went ahead and they built a non-accessible walkway and they put a wall on both the north and the south side of the building that you cannot see it from the sidewalk. There is a little bit on the south side you can see where they put a little pathway around the wall but it's not substantial. It's not really good. The other part of it is, who owns the land? The Town that developed a survey several years ago to re-survey all of the waterfront around Manhasset Bay. I'm not sure if anybody on the board has seen that survey but there is questions of who is the land ownership, who does it belong to. And I think it's very important that we start from there and say what land belongs to the upland owner, what land belongs to the Town. And I think that a lot of this land was filled many years ago and it just accumulated and a lot of the deeds say, to the water or to the Bay or to the mean high water, but they don't account for the filling of the land, which changed all that 15, 20 years ago or even more and a lot of it is fill. I'm very concerned. I used to take my son about about five or six years old and walk along the waterway from Bay View Colony all the way to Knickerbocker and to the Town dock at low tide. That was fun. It was an adventure. It was wonderful. You can't do it anymore. We've already -- it's too late to really grab that back and allow that to happen. And I think we need to really look at this with good public input. I agree with Mindy's paper and agreeing with the way it should be done is an

open, transparent process. I applaud Dina for her work in getting this going and I think it's an excellent concept and we all look forward to working with you and making sure this happens. And I do need to see, for everybody in Port Washington, access to the bay. I think it's a shame that we blocked that access, either visually and/or physical access to walk along the water. I do it all the time and it's just reinvigorating. It's wonderful. Thank you very much.

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: Thank you.

MR. WINK: Thank you. William Gordon.

MR. GORDON: Thank you, Supervisor Bosworth and Council members, for the opportunity to present this. And thank you, Dina, for the moratorium. Because I think it is, as you called it, a time out. It's not the end. It's not the game. It's just let's all step back. I'm a 62-year resident of Port Washington and I grew up on Manhasset Bay starting when I was -- in 1968. I also own a boat rental business that's in one of the properties that could be sold as a part of this process. And this really gives us simply a time to go back and review and do what's right for all -- all of the parties, including the owners. And I actually believe at this time that the conclusion could be better for all parties with that time that we put in. As a business operator, I've been promoting the fact that Port Washington is a destination for many years. My clients stretch the tri-state area but a lot of them are right from the Town of North Hempstead and they come down to the water and we're giving them access to the western Long Island Sound and a boat. So we have clients from all over this Town. And we employ local residents. We do a lot of local business. Our fuel bill last year for the local marinas were over \$30,000 just in fuel purchases. So why? Because the main street waterfront is, as everybody has said, critical. And so the time out really pays, not just for the residents of Port Washington but I do think for the residents of the Town of North Hempstead. And when you do it right, we can see it with Harbor View and Harbor Links and what can be done to really enhance everybody's value. This is just another opportunity to do the same thing. I'm very familiar with the Knickerbocker Hotel. I've been a beneficiary of using the hotel and -- not of the condos, but I do think that the planning was jammed in. The parking is adequate for the residents and for the services that are there. And I've had discussions with the people there, there's not enough parking to deal with the marina, the hotel and the residents. And I think proper planning and careful planning would have been --it would have been much better. So I really applaud the open debate. How it ends up is anybody's guess but all we can ask is a hearing and an open and transparent discussion of it. But I absolutely believe that if we do it right and do what Mindy suggested, carefully thought out -- this is done all over the east coast and all over the waterfront -we can come up with actually a win-win for the owners of the property, the Town and all the other stakeholders with this time. And I do implore you guys to use that planning process to do that because I think we'll -- we'll all come out better. Thank you.

MR. WINK: Caroline Dubois.

MS. DUBOIS: Thank you. I'm Caroline Dubois. I live at 8 Dunes Lane in Manorhaven. I want to thank you, Dina, for starting this process. And I would invite the whole board to expand your vision now that you're talking about the waterfront. First of all, in the Village of Manorhaven, we have had a waterfront building moratorium that was started in June of 2016. It started for six months and it's been continued in six-month chunks up until June of 2018. And one of the reasons it has been expanded for two years is that part of the steps, as I understand it, is first you need permission from the Nassau County Planning Board and one of the things they require is to have a planning study, some kind of a zoning, future planning study. I would suggest that you look into

having a LWRP, which is with the New York State Department of State Coastal Zone Management Group, called your "Local Waterfront Revitalization Program," LWRP. That would be a planning process that would involve hearings and all of the stakeholders. I would also invite you to expand your vision to think about the bay walk and bring it into Manorhaven along the Nature Preserve all the way through the swimming pool to Morgan's Dock and, also, onto Manhasset Isle along the marinas to the Tippen property, which is undeveloped. That's an 11-acre brownfield property. And when you do all of this, just keep in mind that global warming is here and tide rise is coming. So whatever you plan now, we'll probably have to suffer for the next 50 years of whatever kind of Hurricane Sandys we get next. Thank you.

MR. WINK: I have no additional cards on this item.

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: So anyone else that would like to come up?

MS. O'DONNELL: Hi. My name is Tricia O'Donnell. I grew up in Port Washington. I worked at Louie's as a hostess and I actually had a blind date with my now husband at Jimmy's Backyard. So I actually own Pilates in Port. I am the studio facing the water. You can't see me from the street. But I see many passersby, maybe some of you that had ice cream cones at -- at Doug's Place. And the studio I've had for 17 years. I started in a very small little space. I actually cold called it and walked into Tony -- into Tony Ventura -- not Ventora, Tony Reaper. He was the general manager at the time and I said what are you doing with this empty space? And he said, well, the store moved to -- down to Sound View and I said, can I open a Pilates Studio? and we put up a wall. Seventeen years later -- actually in 2008 when the market crashed, I --we took down that wall because Tony got another job and moved off premises and I expanded my business instead of downsizing. So I've known all along that the possibility might come one day when the owner wants to sell the property. That's been brought up from the very beginning and -- but I can tell you from first-hand experience, seeing the passersby, seeing the boat renters, seeing the nail ladies come every week. My clients come from as far as Old Westbury every week, Great Neck, Queens. These are dedicated clients and they come because they want quality instruction, which I provide. But they also like the Town of Port Washington. They like to stop and get an ice cream cone, and I do catch them, and they like to go down by the wharf and take a look at the water and the bay and the boats. So I just would like you to keep us all in mind. I'm passionate about this space and just -- it means a lot. Thank you.

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: Thank you.

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: Thank you. Is there anyone else that would like to come up?

MS. DALIMONTE: Mariann Dalimonte, 6 Reid Avenue, Port Washington. I am a fourth generation from Port Washington, fourth generation. I just want to thank you, Dina and Supervisor Bosworth for proposing this six-month moratorium on a new development under the Town's Waterfront Business District. Port Washington is a destination. If we put three Knickerbockers in a row, while I'm sure the real estate agents will be very happy with because they'll have real estate to sell and they can make a commission, it's going to hurt our community. And it's not fair to the people who have lived here their entire lives. The waterfront is a draw for Port Washington. As you've heard from many people here, there -- it's a destination, Port Washington. And if we don't have the water, what are we going to have? Sunset Park is not a park. It's owned by the Sewer District. You can't count on that as a park and that's open space because one day that might not be open space. So I just want to thank everyone here and I hope everyone votes for this moratorium. Thank you. Have a happy holiday.

Town Board Meeting

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: So I'd just like to add that, you know, these comments are wonderful but what we're here to discuss is having a moratorium and we're going to begin in, you know, my assumption is that based on the comments that we're hearing that we'll go ahead with that and then in the -- and that's just based on the comments that we're hearing. And should we do that, then that would be the time where we'd be hearing from all the different stakeholders to hear what their thoughts about the moratorium.

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: Absolutely. This is not, you know, this is not your last opportunity to tell us what you want -- what your vision is for the waterfront. It's actually, you know, the first step in what's probably going to be a very long process. But, you know, we -- I think anyone that wants to be heard, we should hear you. But, yes, we definitely understand it's important and everyone's -- I have, you know, e-mails, some from people who are here and some not that I'm going to be introducing into the record and anyone knows how to contact me or the Supervisor in terms of any -- of your thoughts on what we should do down there eventually. But if there's anyone else, I think we'd -- anyone else -- come.

MR. UPSEPION: Hello. My name is Greg Upsepion, I live in Port Washington, 52 years. I live at 2 Country Club Drive.

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: I just want to say, it's amazing in Port Washington. I've lived here 52 years, 70 years my family has lived here, you know, for three generations. So it's wonderful.

MR. UPSEPION: I love the waterfront. I paid for college driving a launch at Manhasset Bay Yacht Club. I sail every weekend. The waterfront definitely is part of Port Washington and it needs to be protected. That being said, the property between Louie's and Manhasset Bay Yacht Club is private property. It is not public property. Those people pay grossly \$170,000 a year in property tax on Inspiration Walk. It barely breaks even and it's fully rented. So you're punishing a property holder for over 12 years from being able to improve their property. That being said, Ms. De Giorgio, you just said that there's no pending applications in the waterfront district, which is not true. Louie's has a pending waterfront application for a roof deck party bar currently being approved by the Building Department. So how do we trust that this board's going to do the right thing when you just lied?

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: Well, Mr. Upsepion, that's a misstatement. I didn't lie.

MR. UPSEPION: I just pulled the folder yesterday for Louie's and they told me the Building Department is in the process of approving a roof deck on Louie's.

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: Okay. I'm not going to argue with you. I'm not going to argue with you about -- and that's fine.

MR. UPSEPION: Is that true or is it not true?

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: I don't know if that's true.

MR. UPSEPION: You should know if you're doing a moratorium in the area.

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: Well, the Building Commissioner is here. I don't know that our moratorium affects that application. It may not.

MR. UPSEPION: But yet you said, there's nothing pending and it's pending. Is it true or not pending?

A VOICE: Yes.

MR. UPSEPION: There you go. Why? Thank you very much. Have a great evening. Please protect the waterfront.

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: I'm going to ask the Town – I'm going to ask the Town Attorney to speak to the issue of whether or not the permit is affected by the moratorium.

MS. BOTWIN: I'm going to ask the Chief Deputy Town Attorney to speak to this.

MR. PITNICK: I don't have the law in front of me.

MR. WINK: I can get you a copy.

MR. PITNICK: We can come back to that. I'll get it.

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: Okay. So is there anyone else that would like to be heard?

MR. GALASSO: My name is Phillip Galasso. I represent Main Street USA Enterprises, the owner of Section 5, Block C, Lot 431. While I agree with the last gentlemen that all the properties south of the dock are privately owned, I also disagree that the public has access to the waterfront. The public doesn't, not even at Sunset Park. You can't jump in the water at Sunset Park. You can't put your toe in the water at Louie's unless you have permission to enter the dock area. You can only touch the water if you come by way of the dock. Okay. This particular Block C, Lot 431, has no waterfront. It's 250 feet from the waterfront. It's bound by Main Street, two boundaries by Knickerbocker and one boundary by Bay Marina. So this owner would take a moratorium as being arbitrary and we request that you remove this lot from this moratorium. Thank you.

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: Anyone else?

MR. MAGIDA: Good evening. My name is Ken Magida. I'm a newbie in Town, I'm only in Town since 1985 --'84, actually.

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: You're a newbie.

MR. MAGIDA: I'm speaking tonight as, not only as a resident but as Commodore of the North Shore Yacht Club and my sole interest is access to the waterfront and preserving it for the residents and visitors to Port Washington. I strongly urge that the moratorium be put in effect and that due consideration be given to preserving the waterfront. Thank you.

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: Anyone else? So I am asking the board to enact the moratorium. Any of the people that are here tonight that have an interest in one of the properties that's subject to the moratorium and would like to have a seat at the table or would like to be part of the conversation in terms of what changes, if any, we're going to make to the Zoning Code, I welcome that. I welcome your input. My intention is not to make this an adversarial process at all. The goal would be to try to find a balance between the property owners and their economic interests. I understand the taxes are high there. I disagree that there's not public access to the waterfront. I think that when there's retail businesses there that are open to the public, that's public access to the waterfront. So if you're interested in being part of the process, my legislative aide is in the back of the room, he's raising his hand. You certainly can give him your contact information. If you'd rather not do that, my e-mail is on the Town Board website. You can, of course, e-mail me if you wanted to be kept updated in terms of the process. And as far as the application for Louie's, that application, I wasn't -- I don't think that came to our attention but we'll try to address it tonight. Mitch, do you have an answer about that?

MR. PITNICK: Yeah, we're just going --

MR. MAGIDA: Can you address the lot that's not on the water?

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: So it -- I don't think we can pick and choose what lots the moratorium will be applied to. It's applied in the Business BW Zone so I don't think it's appropriate to choose one lot over another. I think that would actually be inappropriate so I'm not recommending that to the board. I think if there's a moratorium, there's a time out for everyone that's in the BW Zone. There's no reason to exempt one lot over another, I don't think. So, Ms. Botwin, do we have an answer on the permit?

MS. BOTWIN: Sure. It is — it is our opinion that -- that the proposed roof top facility would be an exception under the moratorium because it's an alteration which doesn't result in a new commercial use. I think it's a relatively close question but I think it is a fair reading of the proposal.

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: Okay. Thank you, Ms. Botwin. So the gentlemen left but, you know, maybe should find him and correct his misstatement of the facts, but anyway. So that's what I have -- go ahead.

MS. BOTWIN: I just also wanted to suggest that we note that the law as it was posted originally on line and proposed in the Clerk's office, did not include lot 430, which was an error. And the proposal being voted tonight, does include lot 430 since the notice referred to the entire Business Waterfront District. It's not a defect in the notice but it is something that we caught and corrected and it is the proper -- all the lots are listed in the law as proposed in our Novus agenda system and that's going to be voted by the Town Board tonight.

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: So do we need to amend the -- no.

MS. BOTWIN: No, it's just the proposal before you. It's just noting that when it had previously been made public, that one lot had been left off for a period of the --

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: Okay.

MS. BOTWIN: — of the days before this meeting.

COUNCIL WOMAN DE GIORGIO: But it's included in the version that we're voting on tonight?

MS. BOTWIN: Yes. Right.

MR. MC GEETER: 430 is not here.

MS. BOTWIN: Yes, it is in the version that is being voted tonight.

MR. MAGIDA: But it was not noticed?

MS. BOTWIN: The notice was the entire Waterfront Business District.

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: So is there anyone else? I'd like to close the public hearing, offer the resolution and move for its adoption.

WHEREAS, the Town Board, as the legislative body of the Town of North Hempstead, is empowered to amend the Town Code pursuant to the provisions of Article 9 of the New York State Constitution, the Town Law, and the Municipal Home Rule Law; and

WHEREAS, a proposed Local Law has been prepared pursuant to enabling legislation to amend the Town Code by the adoption of a Local Law amending Chapter 70 of the Town Code entitled "Zoning" in order to establish a moratorium on development in the Waterfront Business (B-W) District; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Local Law, in final form, has been on the desks or tables of all the members of the Town Board for seven calendar days, exclusive of Sunday; and

WHEREAS, due notice has been given of a public hearing to be held on the 19th day of December 2017, concerning the adoption of the proposed Local Law, which Local Law was available for viewing by the public on the Town's website and during regular business hours in the Office of the Town Clerk; and

WHEREAS, the Nassau County Planning Commission (the "Commission"), following a review of the Application pursuant to General Municipal Law 239-m, determined that the Application was a matter for local determination at their meeting duly held on December 14, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board carefully considered the proposed Local Law during the aforesaid seven-day period, conducted the public hearing on December 19, 2017, with respect to the Local Law, and has afforded all interested persons an opportunity to be heard; and

WHEREAS, this Board deems it in the public interest to adopt the proposed Local Law, to

be effective immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State of the State of New York (the

"Secretary of State").

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED that Local Law No. 11 of 2017 be and it hereby is adopted, which Local

Law reads as follows:

TOWN OF NORTH HEMPSTEAD

LOCAL LAW NO. 11 OF 2017

A LOCAL LAW IMPOSING A BUILDING MORATORIUM IN THE WATERFONT BUSINESS DISTRICT (B-W).

Section 1. Legislative Intent.

The Town Board of the Town of North Hempstead finds that it is in the best interest of the Town to impose a one hundred and eighty (180) day moratorium on the development of certain real property in the hamlet of Port Washington identified in Section 2 hereof, requiring the issuance of building permits, demolition permits, special permits, or any other discretionary approval. The moratorium will give the Town Board the opportunity to consider changes in Town zoning regulations to better support water dependent businesses, public access to the waterfront, and preservation of the Town's nautical heritage and history.

Section 2. Scope of Moratorium.

During a period of one hundred eighty (180) days from and after the effective date of this local law, the Town's Department of Building Safety, Inspection and Enforcement shall not issue any building permits, demolition permits, special permits or any other discretionary approval for any property within the Waterfront Business District (B-W), including the following properties, which are identified by reference to the Land and Tax Map of Nassau County:

Section 5, Block B, Lots 171, 46, 500

Section 5, Block C, Lots 9, 431, 2, 428, 427, 462, 463, 16, 429, 430

Section 5, Block H, Lot 2 and 43

Section 3. Exceptions.

Town Board Meeting

This local law shall not apply to the following:

(1) Applications for residential subdivision, residential special permit, and/or residential site plan approval currently pending before any Town department or board, provided such application(s) has either received preliminary subdivision approval and/or a negative declaration and/or a findings statement pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) and the regulations thereunder on or before the effective date of this local law.

(2) The continued development of any residential, commercial or industrial use for which a building permit has been issued by the Town prior to the effective date of this local law or for which a site plan has been approved by the Town Board.

(3) Lot line adjustments where no new lots are being created and no additional dwelling unit(s) are being constructed.

(4) The issuance of a building permit for structural repairs to existing buildings or structures, making existing structures or facilities accessible to persons with a disability, and interior renovations or alterations which do not result in new commercial or industrial uses not in existence on the date of enactment of this local law.

(5) The issuance of a certificate of occupancy in connection with the completion of a project that obtained prior site plan approval or subdivision approval and for which building permits were issued and substantial construction commenced.

Section 4. Variances and Appeals.

Any appeal for a hardship variance related to a prohibition of this local law or a decision by the building inspector pursuant to this local law may be made to the Town Board. In reviewing such variance application, the Town Board shall apply the statutory standards for granting a use or area variance. Should a hardship variance be granted by the Town Board, the exempted development project shall be subject to all applicable provisions of the Code of the Town of North Hempstead.

Section 5. Conflicts with State Statutes and Local Laws and Authority to Supersede.

To the extent that any provisions of this local law are in conflict with or are construed as inconsistent with the provisions of the New York State Town Law or any local ordinance, law, or regulation, this local law supersedes, amends, and takes precedence over the Town Law and such local ordinances, laws or regulations, pursuant to the Town's municipal home rule powers pursuant to Municipal Home Rule Law § 10 and § 22 to supersede any inconsistent authority. Pursuant to the same powers, and without limiting the generality of the foregoing, this local law supersedes the provisions contained in (a) Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law (known as the State Environmental Quality Review Act) and the regulations thereunder to the extent that such provisions require that an agency determine the environmental significance of an

application within certain specified timeframes; and (b) Town Law § 267 and § 267-a through c, pertaining to the variance authority of the board of zoning and appeals.

Section 6. Penalties.

Any person, firm, corporation, or other entity, which shall construct, erect or install any building, improvement, or structure, or subdivide, or use land in violation of the provisions of this local law, shall be guilty of a violation, punishable by a fine of not less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) or by imprisonment no exceeding fifteen (15) days, or by both, for each day that such violation shall exist. Nothing herein shall be construed so as to limit the authority of the Town to seek and obtain injunctive relief for any such violation or violations.

Section 7. Validity and Severability.

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section, or part of this local law or the application thereof to any person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, or business shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section, or part of this local law, or in its specific application.

Section 8. Effective Date.

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State. As provided by law and shall remain in full force and effect for a period of one hundred and eighty (180) days from the effective date.





When I heard this in September when school opened, I followed up with Ms. Bosworth to please expedite the count of our votes that I worked really hard on to have our residents send in that they're in favor of this restriction. I believe the ending tally was 155 votes in favor of this restriction. We're not denying access to the neighborhood. Anybody that needs to enter, just needs to drive one more block and come in at our other entrance on the gate. It's a slight, slight inconvenience for the safety of our children.

The next step on our end is to file a petition. Unfortunately, since it's around the holiday season with Christmas and New Years, there is a moratorium which prevents us from doing so. That moratorium's going to end around January 2nd or so. I want to say January 1st is a Monday, I believe. So January 2nd would be a Tuesday. So that week we would be able to proceed by filing our petition and speed up the process to get these individuals out of the home -- the property, if they're still there. And then ultimately either fix the premises or demolish it on our end, which would save the bank almost certainly a good amount of money since the -- when towns tend to take it upon themselves, it tends to be a bit more costly. Thanks.

COUNCILWOMAN RUSSELL: So this -- this resolution would actually -- this public hearing would give us the authority to direct you to do so and so you still have the option of demolishing it yourself. But if it's not done by the owners of the property, then it will be done by the Town. So it doesn't negate you of that right to do it yourself.

MR. GREENBAUM: No, okay. I understand that. The only thing is that we would be unable to even go about doing so until the eviction process is terminated. In the, you know, in the event that someone is in the property. I actually drove by the property tonight before coming here, and I don't know if everyone is familiar with it, there's a series of boarded up windows and front doors towards -- if you're standing on the outside of it, towards the top left of it, there seems to be a black kind of a screen, if that makes sense and it's uncertain whether or not there's someone residing in it. So just from looking, I wouldn't know for certain. Although, at the time, there didn't seem to be any cars parked in front of it. So we would then need to ultimately, you know, be able to finish that before, you know, we could --

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: How long has the bank been involved with this property?

MR. GREENBAUM: With respect to the foreclosure or the --

MR. WINK: Item 9, a resolution adopting the Town of North Hempstead 2018-2022 capital plan.

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: So good evening. Tonight, our board members and I are going to be voting on our 2018 capital plan. Our goal is to have a fully transparent and open process. To this end, a public work session was conducted that detailed every project included in the capital plan. In addition, we met with each Town Board Member to review projects in detail and discussed the prioritization of the included projects. I'm committed to making capital improvements for our future and I know we all are, while balancing the need to be fiscally conservative. The General Fund Five-Year Capital Plan includes \$91 million of infrastructure investment. The Town will fund the 2018 expenditures with \$8.1 million of additional long-term borrowing after accounting for grants and existing funding. The 2018 capital plan increases the funding allotted to address the Town's critically important infrastructure. And we had so many discussions, Town Council and I have been very concerned about roads, drainage, sidewalk improvement and so we are increasing funding for those elements; the roads, the drainage, the sidewalk improvement. The plan includes: Funding of \$4.2 million for road repaying; \$1 million for sidewalk improvements; and, an additional \$250,000 for concrete road work. In addition, funding of \$100,000 for road and drainage, major emergencies has been included. The five-year plan for our outside Village, includes: Total infrastructure investment of \$39.3 million, with \$8.5 million of additional long-term debt to fund projects in 2018. The plan provides funding to improve the quality of parks for our constituents. Our park system is where we come together as a community for concerts, programs for both seniors and families, some recreation opportunities and to enjoy the various pools. And so I'm just going to digress for a moment and say, Clark Gardens is now having their Winter Wonderland, which is an extraordinary event. It's been going on for the last few days. We've had hundreds and hundreds of visitors. So it's been just wonderful for families. So if you still have children or just if you want to look at a wonderful winter wonderland, it's going to be going on for another few days, please go. Getting back. For example, building off of the locker room improvements completed in 2017 at Whitney Pond Park, the plan provides for the improvement of the grounds surrounding the pool. And Martin Bunky Reid Park. we're planning to install a splash pad, which will further enhance the amenities in this park. Looking toward the future, the North Hempstead Beach Park visioning will continue in 2018. We look forward to sharing various proposal for this park that are based off of the community outreach of meetings that were complete in the initial 2017 visioning phase. As Supervisor, my goal is to work with my fellow Town officials and the community to decide how best to safeguard and improve our Town's treasured facilities and to build to a better future. I'd like to thank: Our Deputy Supervisor, Alain Khatchadourian; and, Finance Director, Jessica Lamendola; along with, Steve Pollock and our DPW team; Paul De Maria; Victor Thomas; and, Rob Fazio, as well as our Commissioners and Department heads who all worked so hard to make sure that we were creating a capital plan that will take us into the future. So with that, I would like to note that there are any comments or any discussion?

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: I just want to say thank you. And I think it's a great capital plan. I think we have a lot of great projects planned. And I want to thank the Supervisor and her staff for providing the information and answering the questions. It's a very ambitious plan so you're all going to be really busy for the next couple of years. But I think it's a good plan and it's exciting. And I appreciate your hard work.

COUNCILWOMAN RUSSELL: I share the sentiments. They have been very, very responsive

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: No, it was great going through budget into this.

COUNCILWOMAN RUSSELL: It was absolutely.

COUNCILWOMAN DE GIORGIO: So you'll have a few days off and then right back at it.

COUNCILWOMAN RUSSELL: But I thank you for including the things that were very important to the Councilmembers with regard to the infrastructure. One of the biggest things, and the most important things that we do in Town government, is ensuring that our infrastructure is in place. And so we're adding money in our budget for infrastructure really hits home for the residents.

COUNCILWOMAN KAPLAN: I feel the same sentiment. I actually was at Greater Council, which is many different council members, civic members in Manhasset and I gave them a rundown of my district or the parts that really was important to them and they were all very appreciative. So, yes, please do get some rest and come back with full energy January 1st.

COUNCILMAN FERRARA Second.

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: Thank you.

COUNCILWOMAN KAPLAN: Angelo just gave you an extra day off.



SUPERVISOR'S STATEMENT

INTRODUCTION

The Town of North Hempstead's spending on capital projects – from road repaving to repairing Townowned facilities to improving our parks—is planned separately from the Town's operating budget. The Capital Plan presents a blueprint of major projects the Town will be pursuing over the next five years. The plan also shows the proposed funding for each project – whether through bonding, operating revenue, grants, or FEMA reimbursement.

Our goal is to have a fully transparent and open process. To this end, a public work session was conducted that detailed every project included in the Capital Plan. In addition, we met with each Town Board member to review projects in detail and discuss the prioritization of the included projects.

As your Town Supervisor, I am committed to making capital improvements for our future, while balancing the need to be fiscally conservative. The costs outlined in this document are preliminary estimates. Every effort will be made to find lower cost options when available and to maximize grant funding, without compromising the quality of our projects.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Infrastructure has a direct impact on the economic health and safety of our Town's residents. It is never good policy to ignore infrastructure problems today and to pass these problems along to future generations. I believe that once a local government lets its aging infrastructure deteriorate, the costs to fix it grow exponentially.

The 2018 Capital Plan increases the funding allotted to address the Town's critically important road infrastructure; we are increasing funding for road, drainage, and sidewalk improvements. The Plan includes funding of \$4.2 million for road repaying and an additional \$250,000 for concrete road work. In addition, funding of \$100,000 for road drainage major emergencies has been included.

Sidewalks have been given special attention in this capital plan. I have recommended an increase in the funding allocation from \$100,000 to \$1 million annually.

STORMRESILIENCYANDMITIGATION

The Town continues to plan changes to meet the increasing intensity of climate change. In order to handle future weather events such as hurricanes, the Town plans to construct two debris management sites at Michael J. Tully Park and North Hempstead Beach Park. The Town also plans to reconstruct the Town Dock to fix damage from Superstorm Sandy and make it more resilient.

PARKSINFRASTRUCTUREANDENHANCEMENT

North Hempstead's park facilities are the face of the Town and it is vital to invest funds and resources to help improve and preserve them for future generations. The Town's 16 active parks, 5 athletic fields, and 28 passive parks enhance the lives of our residents in countless ways. They are an integral part of what makes North Hempstead a very special place to live and raise a family. Our Town's many green spaces provide residents with extraordinary landscapes and function as open-air classrooms for our children.

The plan provides funding to improve the quality of parks for our constituents. We are building off of the locker room improvements finished in 2017 at Whitney Pond Park, and will be completing work to

improve the grounds surrounding the pool. At Martin "Bunky" Reid Park we are planning to install a splash pad which will further enhance the amenities in this park when residents go there to enjoy the outdoor classroom completed in 2017. The CGM Park pool replacement will be completed in calendar 2018 and park district residents will be able to swim there this summer.

Looking towards the future, the North Hempstead Beach Park visioning will continue in 2018. We look forward to sharing various proposals for this park that are based off of the community outreach and meetings that were completed in the initial 2017 visioning phase.

PRESERVINGTOWNHISTORY

Our Town's historical buildings add to the unique character of our community and serve as reminders of our past. The Capital Plan includes the continued restoration of the Schumacher House at Clinton G. Martin Park, for which the Town has already received nearly \$500,000 in grants. Once restored, Schumacher will serve as a link to the past and educate residents about our local history.

PUBLICSAFETY

Protecting the health, safety and welfare of our residents is of paramount importance and the Department of Public Safety plays a vital role in the area of emergency management. The Capital Plan will assist us in our efforts to create a stronger and more effective Public Safety Department in the Town. This year, the Capital Plan encompasses much-needed enhancements and updates to both vehicles and security equipment that will enable the Department to work seamlessly with other local Public Safety Departments and Offices of Emergency Management.

CONCLUSION

As Supervisor, my goal is to work with my fellow Town officials and the community to decide how best to safeguard and improve our Town's treasured facilities and build to a better future.

S U M M A R Y O F P R O P O S E D C A P I T A L S P E N D I N G General Fund

The General Fund five-year Capital Plan includes \$91 million of infrastructure investment. The Town will fund the 2018 expenditures with \$8.1 million of additional long-term borrowing, after accounting for grants and existing funding.

In developing this Plan, the Town took into account grants that have already been awarded. We assume that federal and state grant funding will continue in future years and the Town will be aggressive in applying for all possible additional grants to reduce the costs of these Projects to Town taxpayers.

Town Outside Village

The Five Year Plan includes total infrastructure investment of \$39.3 million with \$8.5 million of additional long-term debt to fund projects in 2018.



The goal is to stop flow through the culvert by installing precast assemblies or a coffer dam around the perimeter of the spillway that that would raise elevation, thereby diverting the pond flow to the new overflow crossing. Once flow is diverted, a coffer dam can be built at the outlet side of the culvert and the culvert walls and ceiling blasted wand cleaned in preparation for the arch insert installation. Reinforcement of the annular space between the new arch and the existing walls and ceiling is required. The elevation of the temporary top of the weir and the top of the coffer dam will be calculated during the design phase to provide a safety overtopping in the event of a storm during construction. The Town is still discussing with Village officials how to resolve payment of costs for this work that exceeds the grant.

The estimated maximum cost thereof, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof, is \$1,020,957 and said amount is hereby appropriated for such purpose. The plan of financing includes the issuance of bonds of the Town in the principal amount of \$1,020,957 to finance said appropriation, and the levy and collection of taxes on all the taxable real property in the Town to pay the principal of said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable.

Section 2. Bonds of the Town in the principal amount of not to exceed \$1,020,957 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called the "Law"), to finance said appropriation.

Section 3. The period of probable usefulness applicable to the object or purpose for which said bonds are authorized to be issued, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a. 91 of the Law, is fifteen (15) years.

Section 4. The proceeds of the bonds herein authorized, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, may be applied to reimburse the Town for expenditures made after the effective date of this resolution for the purpose for which said bonds are authorized. The foregoing statement of intent with respect to reimbursement is made in conformity with Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 of the United States Treasury Department.

Section 5. The proposed maturity of the bonds authorized by this resolution will exceed five years.

Section 6. Each of the bonds authorized by this resolution, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, shall contain the recital of validity as prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and said bonds, and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, shall be general obligations of the Town, payable as to both principal and interest by general tax upon all the taxable real property within the Town. The faith and credit of the Town are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds, and any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, and provision shall be made annually in the budget of the Town by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and any notes in anticipation thereof to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

Section 7. Subject to the provisions of this resolution and of the Law and pursuant to the provisions of Section 21.00 of the Law relative to the authorization of the issuance of bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, Section 30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes and Section 50.00 and Sections 56.00 to 60.00 and 168.00 of the Law, the powers and duties of the Town Board relative to authorizing bond anticipation notes and prescribing the terms, form and contents and as to the sale and issuance of the bonds herein authorized, and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and the renewals of said bond anticipation notes, and the powers and duties relative to executing contracts for credit enhancements and providing for substantially level or declining annual debt service, are hereby delegated to the Supervisor, the chief fiscal officer of the Town.

Section 8. The validity of the bonds authorized by this resolution, and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, may be contested only if:

In addition to the \$2,000,000 bonds of the Town authorized pursuant to the 2016 Bond Resolution, bonds of the Town in the principal amount of not to exceed \$426,115 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called the "Law"), to finance said additional appropriation.

Section 3. The period of probable usefulness applicable to the object or purpose for which said bonds are authorized to be issued, within the limitations of Sections 11.00 a. 4 of the Law, is forty (40) years.

Section 4. The proceeds of the bonds herein authorized, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, may be applied to reimburse the Town for expenditures made after the effective date of this resolution for the purpose for which said bonds are authorized. The

foregoing statement of intent with respect to reimbursement is made in conformity with Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 of the United States Treasury Department.

Section 5. The proposed maturity of the bonds authorized by this resolution will exceed five years.

Section 6. Each of the bonds authorized by this resolution, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, shall contain the recital of validity as prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and said bonds, and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, shall be general obligations of the Town, payable as to both principal and interest by general tax upon all the taxable real property within the Town. Subject to the provisions of this resolution and of the Law and pursuant to the provisions of Section 21.00 of the Law relative to the authorization of the issuance of bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, Section 30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes and Section 50.00 and Sections 56.00 to 60.00 and Section 168.00 of the Law, the powers and duties of the Town Board relative to authorizing bond anticipation notes and prescribing the terms, form and contents and as to the sale and issuance of the bonds herein authorized, and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and the renewals of said bond anticipation notes, and the powers and duties relative to executing contracts for credit enhancements and providing for substantially level or declining annual debt service, are hereby delegated to the Supervisor, the chief fiscal officer of the Town.
