

Lesson Plan:

Town of North Hempstead Earth Day T-shirt Contest

Grade Level: K-12

Curriculum Connections: Fine Arts, Language Arts (listening skills), History, & Science

Class Time: 45 Minutes to an hour (this lesson can be given as an extra credit assignment or done as a class project)

Lesson plan is made up of the following components:

- 1) A history of Earth Day
- 2) Five (5) biographies of people who have made a significant impact on our environment.
(For grades 6-12)
- 3) An image designed by a student of North Hempstead to be used on the T-shirts for this year's Town of North Hempstead celebration of Earth day. (This lesson gives students a chance to express their creativity.)

Teacher Guide

Summary:

The Town of North Hempstead is once again getting ready for Earth Day and hopes you and your students will join us for this year's celebration. There will be events all over the Town geared towards community clean ups and educating residents on ways we can make our earth a cleaner place to live.

Earth Day is one of the Town's most cherished events of the year and residents of all ages and from all communities participate in this yearly celebration.

We hope you and your students will join us in celebrating Earth Day this year!

Objective:

To gain an understanding of our environment and community by creating an image to be used on T-shirts for the Town of North Hempstead's celebration of Earth Day.

How to begin:

- a) Introduce the lesson by giving the students a history of Earth Day.
- b) For students in grades 6 through 12: Ask the student to read one or all of the biographies of the five Earth Day chosen environmentalists: Margaret Murie, "Grandmother of the Conservation Movement", Andy Lipkis, founder of TreePeople, Rachel Carson, author of "Silent Spring," Noble Peace Prize Winner, Wangari Maathai and Senator Gaylord Nelson, "The Founder of Earth Day". - c) Start a dialogue with your students about conservation.
- d) Distribute the student activity page to your students and explain contest rules.

Student Activity:

Over the past decade the Town of North Hempstead has created a T-shirt each year for its celebration of Earth Day. This T-shirt will be given out to local civic groups, students, and residents who are holding special community clean-ups around our Town. Once again we are reaching out to our young constituents and asking them to design a T-shirt based on the theme **Town of North Hempstead-"Keeping it Green!"**

Contest Rules:

1. The contest is open to all students in grade levels K-12th.
2. Designs must be on 8.5" by 11" paper. (Sample sheet is below.)
3. Design is limited to three colors (**BLUE, GREEN, & BLACK**)
4. Students may enter as many times as they would like.
